## I. SYSTEM PURPOSE

## II. STATE TRANSITION MODEL

## III. POWER STRUCTURE

Control is transferred at initiation and returned at closure.

## IV. ESCALATION LADDER

Level 1: Verbal correction

Level 2: Repetition enforcement

Level 3: Physical discipline

Level 4: Restriction

Escalation triggered by repetition failure or resistance.

De-escalation occurs immediately upon compliance.

## V. CORRECTION PROTOCOL

Come here.

## VI. FAILURE RECOVERY

If protocol breaks:

- Pause system
- Re-establish baseline
- Re-declare authority
- Restart from initiation

## VII. IDENTITY CONDITIONING

Post-session language ties behavior to identity.

Examples:

- “This is who you are when you are aligned.”
- “This is how you hold yourself.”

## VIII. RITUALIZATION

Entry position is consistent.

Commands are consistent.

Sequence is consistent.

Environment is consistent.

Consistency builds imprint.

## IX. COMMAND ECONOMY

Come here.

Hold.

Again.

Stay.

Try again. Clean.

That's the standard.

Lesson closed.

Baseline.

## X. AFTERCARE SYSTEM

Breathing → Contact → Reassurance

Must be executed every session without exception.

## XI. CORE RULE

Consequence without closure produces fear.

Closure produces trust.

## XII. FINAL DIRECTIVE

Authority is consistency.

Structure is control.

Closure is stability.
